Evelyn Anthony's superb new romantic thriller is set against a brilliant international background of high society and horse-racing.

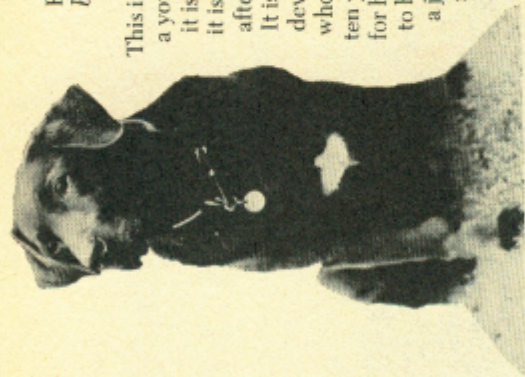
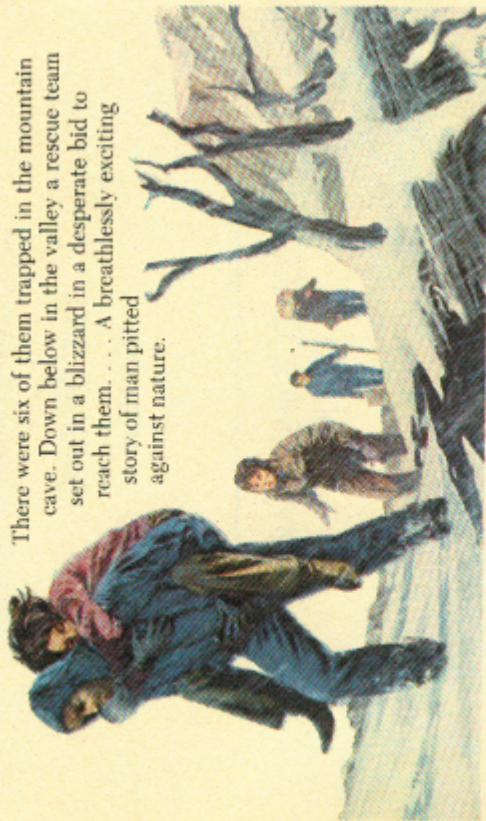
